Smoking Cessation Clinic Evaluation Tool (Version 1.1)

- 1. This is a tool for healthcare organisation consultants, managers, professionals and assessors to evaluate and improve the quality of service of a smoking cessation clinic. It can also be used to guide the setting up of a new smoking cessation clinic/service. It can be used for self evaluation or by others. Earlier versions, without a manual, have been tested by many clinics, and we have feedbacks that the tool is useful and easy to complete. Nevertheless, a manual is attached for reference.
- 2. This tool contains four sections, including organisation assessment, environment assessment, process assessment, and outcome assessment.
- 3. Please tick the items that the smoking cessation clinic/service has fulfilled, then add up the point (score) specified in the parentheses "()" for each ticked item. Some items offer a few answer options. Please select only one option that is most appropriate, and add up the point (score) specified in the corresponding parentheses "()". The points (scores) are designed to be as simple and clear as possible, and the weighting is inevitably crude and arbitrary at this stage for this basic version.
- 4. This tool is designed for the smoking cessation clinics/services affiliated with the hospitals or community healthcare centres. Some items may not be appropriate for those independent smoking cessation clinics/services. If you find that some questions are not applicable for whatever reasons, please make notes in the margins. The final score as a percentage can be calculated after excluding the non-applicable questions.
- 5. We do not set cutoffs or thresholds for grading such as pass or fail, or satisfactory or unsatisfactory at this stage.
- 6. Comments and suggestions are most welcome.

Section 1.Organisation Assessment (11 items with 17 points)Organisation assessment focuses on the aspects of manpower, equipment, technology and system of a smoking cessation clinic/service.
