The scene changes, a dead man in seen on a bed. Someone is covering the body with a plain white cloth. The scene changes, a man is smoking.

Voice over: Vascular disease.

The scene shows blood diffusing in water. Close up shot of the pupil of an eye. The scene changes, a man is pressing on the table and panting heavily at home. The scene changes, the man puts on an oxygen mask and is breathing hard. Scene changes again, a lung is oozing blood.

Voice-over: Respiratory disease.

The scene shows a man holding an oxygen mask at home and panting. The scene changes, doctors are performing an operation in an operation theatre.

Voice over: Heart disease.

The scene shows a man sitting on the bed in a ward. He lays open his shirt to show the scar on the chest after operation.

Voice-over: Cancer. If you smoke, you may suffer from all of them!

The scene returns to the man's home, he looks dull, starts panting, then he holds his head with both his hands and seems to be in torture. Some quick scenes of various patients struggling in bed painfully. The scene changes and shows the doctors are putting on the oxygen mask for a patient in an operation room.

Voice-over: But, if you quit smoking today you still have a chance to avoid them

The scene shows "Smoking = Diseases" A child's hand holds the patient's hand in bed.

Voice-over: Call 1833 183 now.
